

# By-law No. GG-009: RESPECTING PLASTIC BAG REDUCTION

The Council of the Municipality of Grand Bay-Westfield under authority vested in it by Sections 10 of the *Local Governance Act*, 2021, c. 44 and amendments thereto enacts as follows:

### **SHORT TITLE**

1. This By-law may be cited as the Plastic Bag Reduction By-law.

## **DEFINITIONS**

- 2. In this by-law:
  - (i) **"business**" means any corporation, individual, partnership or co-operative association engaged in a retail operation and, for the purpose of section 3, includes a person employed by, or acting behalf of a business;
  - (ii) "check-out bag" means:
    - a) Any bag intended to be used by customer for the purpose of transporting items purchased or received by the customer from the business providing the bag, or
    - b) a bag used to package take-out food or food to be delivered, and includes a paper bag or plastic bag but does not include a reusable bag.
    - (iii) "Council" means Grand Bay-Westfield Town Council;
    - (iv) "paper bag" means a bag made out of paper that is recyclable;
    - (v) "plastic bag" means any bag made with plastic, including biodegradable plastic or compostable plastic, but does not include a reusable bag;
    - (vi) "re-usable bag" means a bag with handles that is:
      - a) designed and manufactured to be capable of a least 100 uses, and
      - b) primarily made of cloth or durable material suitable for re-use

# **CHECK OUT PROHIBITION**

3. Except as provided in this by-law, no business shall provide a check-out bag to a customer that is a plastic bag.

4. No business shall deny or discourage the use by a customer of the customer's own reusable bag for the purpose of transporting items purchased or received by the customer.

### **EXEMPTIONS**

- 5. Section 3 does not apply to bags used to:
  - (i) package loose bulk items such as fruit, vegetables, nuts, grains, or candy;
  - (ii) package loose small hardware items such as nails and bolts;
  - (iii) contain or wrap frozen foods, meat, poultry or fish whether pre- packaged or not;
  - (iv) wrap flowers or potted plants;
  - (v) protect prepared foods or bakery goods that are not pre-packaged;
  - (vi) contain prescription drugs received from a pharmacy;
  - (vii) transport live fish;
  - (viii) protect linens, bedding or other similar large items that cannot easily fit in a reusable bag;
  - (ix) protect newspapers or other printed material intended to be left at the customer's residence or place of business;
  - (x) protect clothes after professional laundering or dry-cleaning;
  - (xi) protect tires that cannot easily fit in a reusable bag.
- 6. <u>Section 3</u> does not limit or restrict the sale of bags, including plastic bags, intended for the use at the customer's home or business, that are sold in packages of multiple bags.

## **ENFORCEMENT**

- 7. Every person duly appointed by Council as a By-law Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized to carry out any inspection that is necessary for the administration or enforcement of this By-law.
- 8. Any Peace Officer or By-law Enforcement Officer is here by authorized to take such actions, exercise such powers and perform such duties, as may be set out in this By-law or in the *Local Governance Act* and as they may deem to be necessary to enforce any provision of this By-law.

#### **OFFENCES**

### By-law No. GG-009: Respecting Plastic Bag Reduction

- 9. Any person who violates any provision of this By-law is guilty of an offence and is liable on conviction to a fine.
- 10. The minimum fine for an offence committed under this By-law is one hundred and forty dollars (\$140) and the maximum fine for an offence committed under this By-law is two thousand one hundred dollars (\$2,100)
- 11. If an offence committed under this By-law continues for more than one (1) day:
  - (i) The minimum fine that may be imposed is the minimum fine established in this by-law multiplied by the number of days during which the offence continues; and
  - (ii) The maximum fine that may be imposed is the maximum fine established in this by-law multiplied by the number of days during which the offence continues.

### ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY

- 7.1 The municipality may require an administrative penalty to be paid with respect to a contravention of a provision of this by-law as set out in section [7.2] of this by-law.
  - (i) A person who contravenes[a provision of this by-law may pay to the municipality an administrative penalty in the amount of
    - a. where the person has not previously contravened this by-law, \$100.00, and
    - b. where the person has previously contravened this by-law, the sum of the amount paid or to be paid by the person in respect of the most recent contravention and \$100.00, provided that in no event shall a person be required to pay an administrative penalty in an amount exceeding \$1,500.00,
  - (ii) and, upon such payment, the person who committed the contravention is not liable to be prosecuted therefor.
- 7.2 A person who may pay to the municipality an administrative penalty in accordance

with this by-law may pay the administrative penalty in accordance with the Administrative Penalty By-law.

# **SEVERABILITY**

12. Where a Court of competent jurisdiction declares any section or part of a section of this By-law invalid, the remainder of this By-law shall continue in force unless the Court makes an order to the contrary.

## **REPEAL**

13. By-law No. 67, a By-law of the Town of Grand Bay-Westfield Plastic Bag Reduction By-law enacted, 22 February 2021, and all amendments thereto is hereby repealed.
